Pipefitters Association Local Union 537 100 Years of Building Boston and Standing Up for the Working Middle Class



The United Association of Boston Pipefitters Local Union 537 celebrated its 100th Anniversary this year at the Seaport World Trade Center and was attended by over 2400 members and supporters of the labor movement. This was a momentous milestone reached for the working middle class tradesmen of our Commonwealth.

Boston Pipefitters Local Union 537 was issued its original Charter in 1911. Local Union 537 members are direct descendants of the original Steam Fitters Union organized in the late 1870's. The 1870's and 1880's marked the beginning of a boom in development and high prosperity. Local Building Trades Unions were established to protect tradesmen during this time of high demand for skilled labor. Individuals united to earn a fair wage, institute safety standards and most importantly they fought to be treated with respect. Because of the efforts of our forefathers, Unions of all different professions, not just Building Trades Unions, have been accredited to being a major component in the development of the middle class. Unions are responsible for the creation of securing our 40 hour work week, paid overtime, and the allowance of time off for vacations, holidays and sick leave, to name but a few. Unions fought for safe and comfortable working conditions. Many original buildings and factories built in Massachusetts had no safety standards or air ventilation systems; let alone windows for their employees. Think of how your life and working environment would be different today, if our forefathers were not allowed to organize and fight for the very working standards that protect us today.

I am Leo Fahey, Business Manager of the Pipefitters Association Local Union 537. Our Union is fighting for the same issues our Union Brothers and Sisters strived for 100 years ago; building, renovating, and servicing in a way that is beneficial to corporate America, the community, and the working men and women. Unions create a safe working environment for the worker as well as the people who ultimately wind up utilizing the facilities that are being built, renovated, or serviced. While doing so, Unions secure a beneficial wage structure for the Tradespersons and Professionals alike.

Unions fight for legislation to ensure our buildings, bio-pharmaceutical plants, power plants, schools, universities and healthcare facilities are built with local union tradespersons who are the most highly skilled, trained, licensed, governed by, and educated with the

most current safety standards. Unions are uniquely vested in building the highest quality facilities in our communities because our families, neighbors and friends will use these facilities. Because of our commitment to excellence our Brotherhood has a five year apprenticeship program prior to reaching journeyman and journeywoman status. Each apprentice trains in our state of the art training facility along with being mentored in the field. Boston Pipefitters Local Union 537 trains apprentices in the field during the day and are classroom educated in simulated working environments at our school in the evening. We are all extremely dedicated to our craft. Local 537 Journeymen and women go beyond industry standards, continuing their education long after their apprenticeship has concluded. Gaining access to and implementing the latest safety standards, reaching higher certifications and staying educated with new technology developments.

Boston Pipefitters Local Union 537 also honors the service of our Military men and women by participating in our International Union's (The United Association (UA) of Plumbers, Pipefitters and Sprinklerfitters and HVAC Technicians) Veterans In Piping (VIP) Program, which recognizes our Veterans service to our country by offering our Veterans the opportunity to come home and pursue a rewarding career in the Pipefitting Industry, giving our military heroes the chance for lifelong employment.

The New England Mechanical Contractors Association (NEMCA) joins in our effort for safety and quality control, and most importantly; care about the people they employ. Apart from their non-union competitors, NEMCA and Local 537 members negotiate a personal benefits package in the form of employee healthcare, annuity, pension plans and education. These benefits accumulate for each member individually over the years, from contractor to contractor, ensuring our members can retire with dignity by investing their own money, toward their future and financial security.

Today's Unions have to fight against the misconception that Unions are to blame for the current economic breakdown of our country, when in fact; fighting for the middleclass families of this country is at the very core of what we do. Unions are after all, just men and women in your community. We are your neighbors. We work hard to support our families, support our own healthcare plans, save for retirement, support

our community by paying our taxes, we participate in local elections, we reach out to our returning veterans and we support the right to organize in order for each individual to receive an honest day's wage for an honest day's work. This is exactly why the prevailing wage laws within this Commonwealth need to be kept intact. **The Prevailing Wage structure sets the very living wage that we ALL benefit from. Without an organized Union presence, wages in all sectors can and will be adjusted.**

I speak to you as a member of the middle class, not just a Union member. The middle class must UNITE to ensure its survival. We must "fight together" to stop the outsourcing of jobs leaving our communities and/or moving overseas. Together, the middle class must insist our communities are not built by out of state companies, with out of state workers, and taking advantage of our Commonwealth's tax break incentives. Building, renovating, and servicing with an out of state, unlicensed, untrained and unregulated work force, whose wages get spent out of state, instead of stimulating and contributing to the Massachusetts economy, is a huge mistake! Support your neighbors. Better yet support our neighbors and the Commonwealth; because after all; isn't that what Massachusetts is? A Commonwealth! Please contact our legislators and insist our buildings are built and maintained by your local Union workforce.

About Local 537 & Local Leadership

Pipefitters Local 537 install piping systems that carry hot water, steam, air, or other liquids or gases needed for industrial production or other uses. We install both high and low pressure systems in Industrial and Commercial Facilities. We also install process piping systems within Semi-Conductor, Bio-Pharmaceutical, and Nano-Technology facilities. We lay out, fabricate, and assemble pipes from drawings, blue prints, and specifications. The members of Local 537 also install piping for heating and cooling systems. Pipefitters work both inside and out on new construction projects and also on maintenance and renovation job sites.

The five-year apprenticeship program in conjunction with on the job training teaches the skills necessary to be a tradesperson. Basic math, science and various welding procedures are examples of course curriculum. Pipefitters Local 537 also has a five-year apprenticeship program for our Air Conditioning and Refrigeration Service Division. This division's members maintain and service all the equipment for the HVAC and Refrigeration markets throughout our jurisdiction in New England.

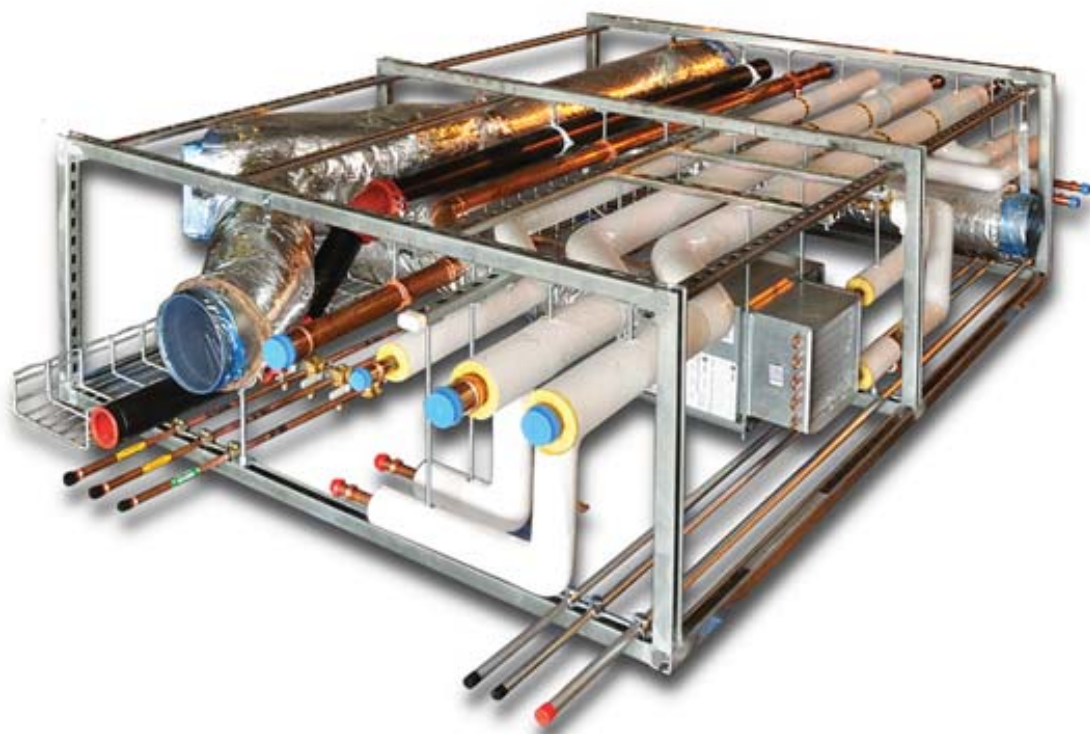

Back From Iraq, Soldiers Ask: What Next?

International Union Offers Training, New Future

Boston, MA – We declare our admiration for the soldiers who serve our country bravely in Iraq, Afghanistan, and other troubled parts of the world. Yet when they leave military service, they often experience difficulty in finding civilian employment, with bleak odds for finding good, long-term careers.

According to US Marine Corps' Major General (Ret.) Matt Caulfield, the unemployment rate of U.S. armed services veterans, ages 22-24, has reached as high as three times that of non-veterans in the same age group. It's hard to believe that the discipline, ethics and values taught in the military are not tangible assets on a job application. When in actuality, the truth is exactly the opposite.

This national crisis is now being addressed by an organization that couples the intangible characteristics taught by the military with specialized training in a field ripe with opportunity. The United Association of Plumbers, Pipefitters and Sprinklerfitters (UA) has developed the Veterans In Piping (VIP) program which offers promise for lifelong employment. The United Association (UA) VIP program has been so successful that UA General President William P. Hite is starting another VIP program in HVACR (Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration) training scheduled to begin early next year.

The Right Thing to Do

"It's the right thing to do," said UA General President William Hite. "These men and women have given so much to their country, and we want to reward them with a life after their service to their country."

Boston Pipefitters Association Local Union 537 Business Manager, Leo J. Fahey, is an active supporter of the returning Veterans. "Now it is our duty to serve our military men and women coming back from Iraq, Afghanistan, and other parts of the world after they served their country so selflessly," he stated. "We value their elite military training and at Local 537 we use it to our benefit. Local 537 also offers our Veterans "Brotherhood." An important component experienced in both the Military and Union way of life. "Veterans are perfect apprentice candidates when it comes to the personal characteristics, quality of an individual, the dedication, team work, and most importantly the discipline required to complete our apprentice program to become a journeyman."

This isn't the first endeavor by UA leaders and members to step up to the plate for military veterans. Their organization was one of the founders of Helmets to Hardhats. They also utilize the not-for-profit Hire a Hero for recruiting, and work closely with the armed forces Wounded Warriors Programs. However, the

VIP program is a separate UA initiative and a great passion of President Hite's.

The Workforce of Today and Tomorrow

A new group of candidates will be selected to begin apprentice training each year. Partnered with the contractors of NEMCA (New England Mechanical Contractors' Association) apprentices receive valuable on the job training in addition to the class study program. They will remain apprentices for five years until qualifying for Journeyman status.

The returning Veterans and apprentices receive quality training in a new field, great jobs with good pay and good benefits. "It is not just a job, it's a career," stated Fahey.

Business Manager Fahey personally thanks each of the Military apprentices for their service to the United States and welcomes them into the "Brotherhood" along with the other qualified apprentices.

The military is a strong supporter of United Associations plan to integrate our veterans back into the civilian labor force. "This is the prototype that is going to revolutionize the way military transitioning into the civilian sector takes place going forward," said Major General Caulfield. "The UA is a training organization and they are leading the way."

Program is Solution for Another Lurking Problem

In addition to helping returning vets, the training of this military workforce will fill a huge gap left by retiring welders and tradesmen. "No other source provides a better recruitment tool to fill the ranks of the retiring baby boomers," stated Business Manager Fahey, "These men and women possess the necessary leadership skills, critical thinking skills, strong work ethic and a desire to learn."

The UA and the military agree: this military transition and re-training program needs to be a nationwide initiative, not just a commitment by the building trades. The problem is huge on a national scale, and the solution should be, as well. With the UA VIP Program thriving in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and other States around the Country – the UA is ready with the resources to make it happen.
